



Double Data vs VK


- Social network VK filed a lawsuit against the tech startup Double Data
- VK state they have sui generis right to the database of user data
- Precedent case about big data



Key Questions of the Case

- 1. IP right to the database?
- 2. Do search engines infringe IP rights?
- 3. Can social network limit access to the publicly available information?


Database protection in Russia







Does VK make a substantial investment?



Substantial investment into creation of the database

Sui generis or spin-off?

EU approach: *sui generis* database right protects substantial investments, not spin-off products

The British Horceracing Board v William Hill Organisation



No substantial investment into search and collection of materials = no sui generis right


Ryanair cases



Investments into development and support of website ≠ substantial investment into creation of database



Can VK Limit Access to the Open Data?

Open page



«Generally accessible information may be used by any persons at their discretion...» (Federal Law "On information...")

hiQ v LinkedIn: Threat to Free Flow of Information



"[C]onferring on private entities ...the blanket authority to block viewers from accessing information publicly available on its website for any reason:

- "could pose an ominous threat to public discourse and the free flow of information promised by the Internet"
- "LinkedIn's behavior may be anticompetitive conduct in violation of California's Unfair Competition Law"
